SAINT OF THE WEEK ST MONICA

Most of us think of Saint Monica in association with her son, the great Saint Augustine.

Familiar, too, are the now famous words of an unknown bishop to Saint Monica: 'The child of such tears will never perish.' We are introduced, as it were, to Saint Monica sorrowing.

Sorrow played a big part in the life of Saint Monica; the sorrow of a loving wife for a harsh spouse and a devoted mother to a wayward son. Life was not kind to Saint Monica

In spite of every difficulty, Monica brought up her children in faith and piety. We are indebted to Saint Augustine's own writings for the information. Alone with her grief, but incessant in prayer, Monica witnessed, through many years, the acute mental and moral struggles of Augustine. Eventually, however, through St Monica's faithfulness and prayers, her son was baptised and goes on to become an incredible theologian and doctor of the Church.
